

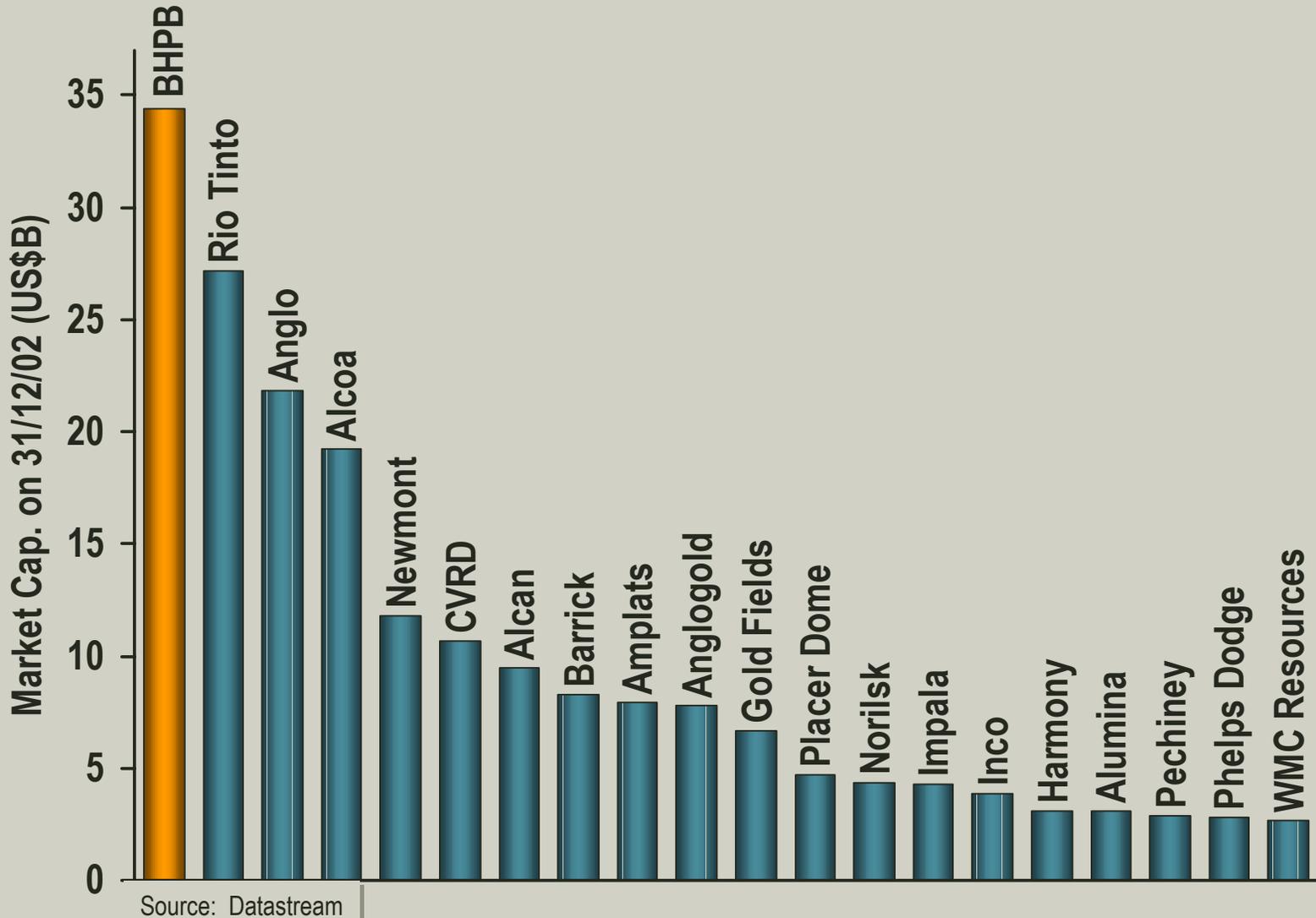

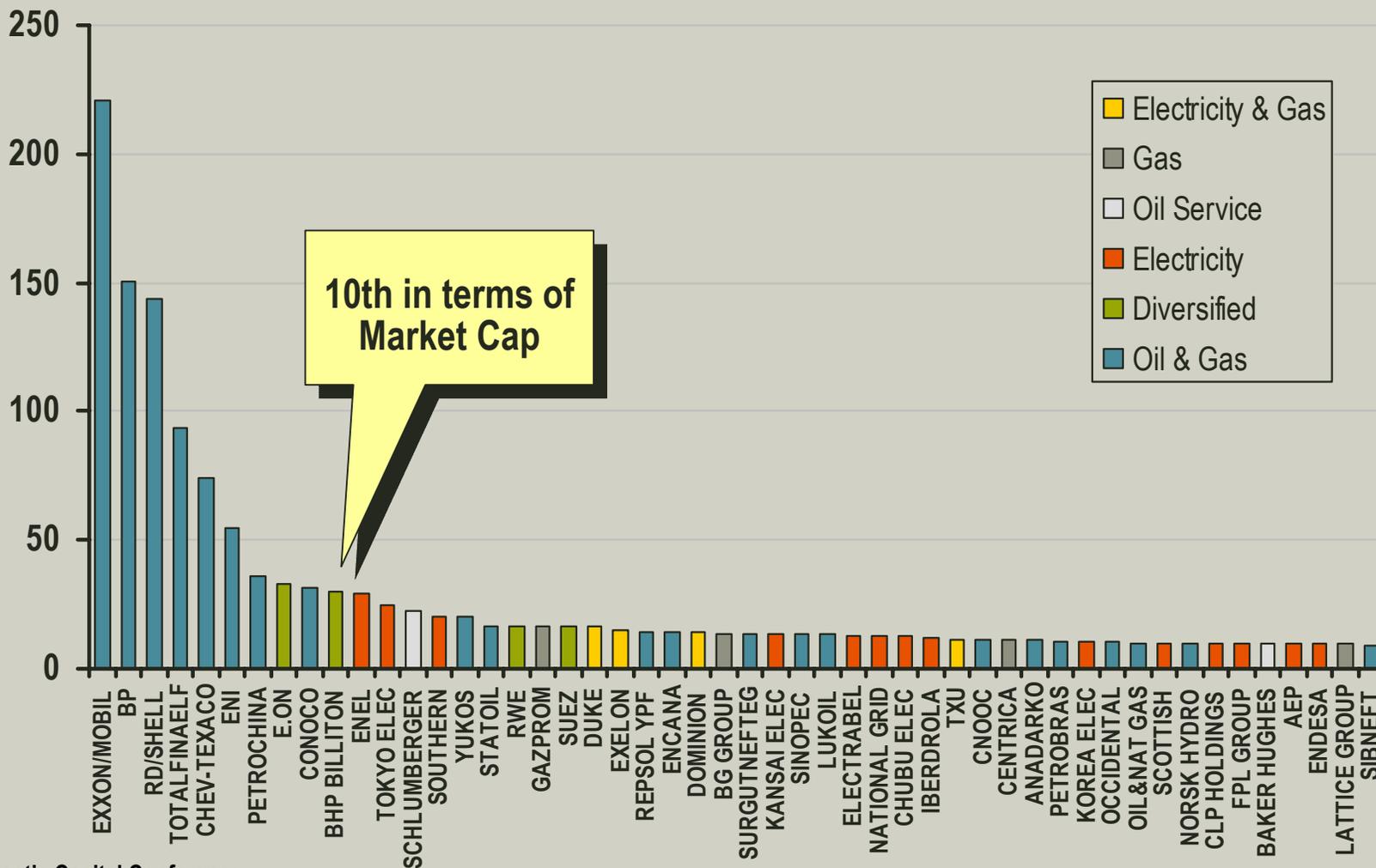

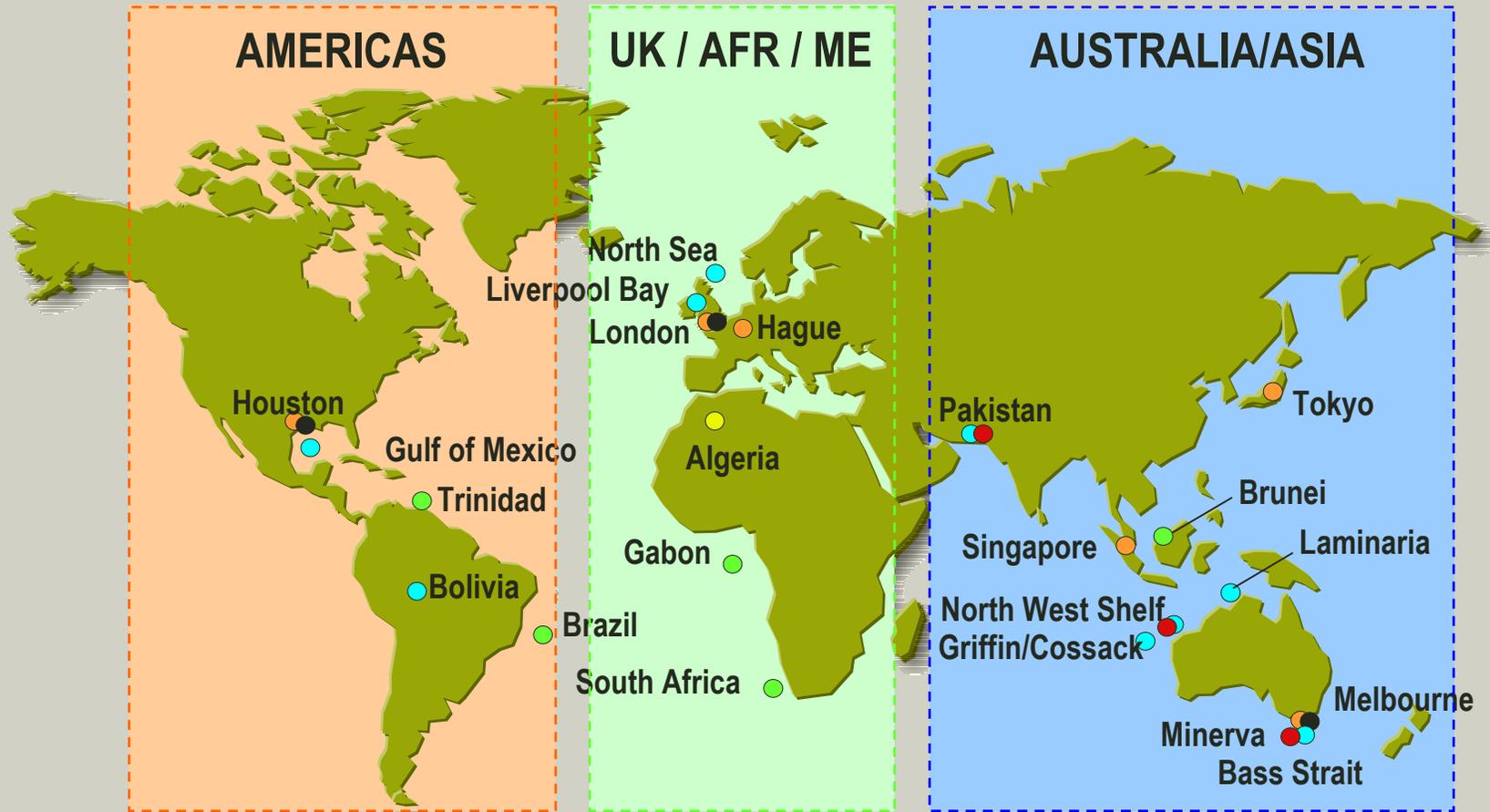

(US\$ Billion)



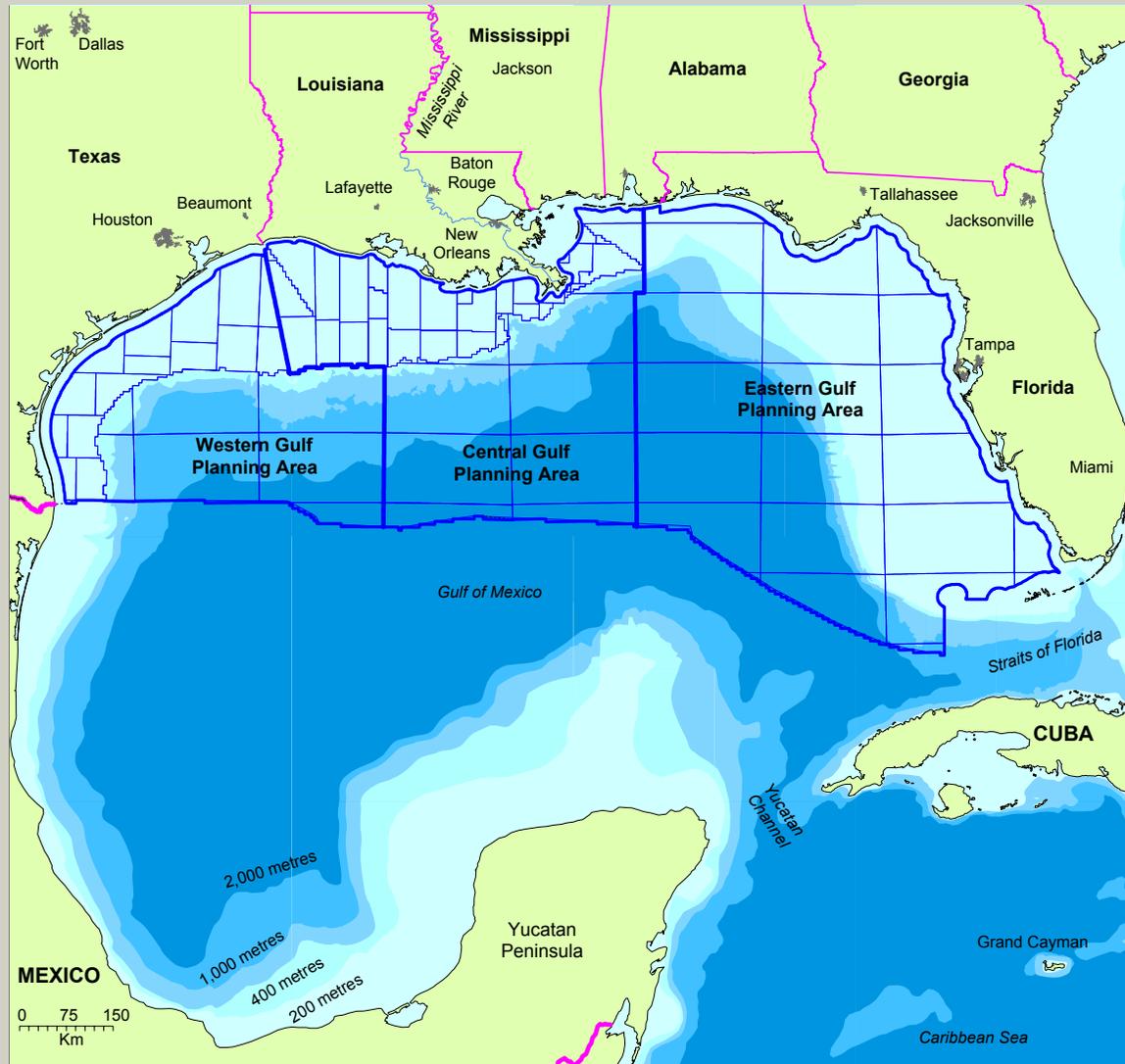

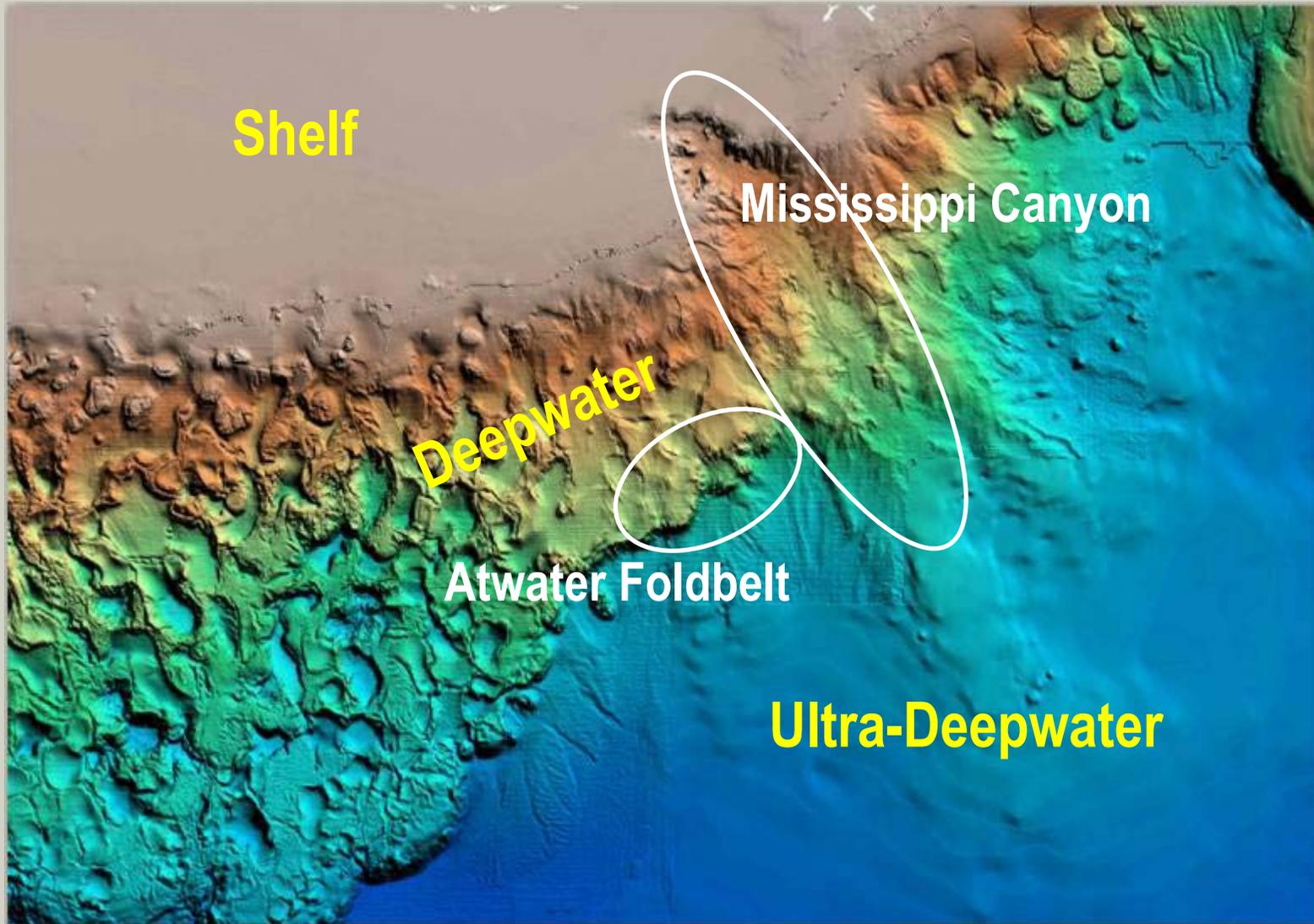

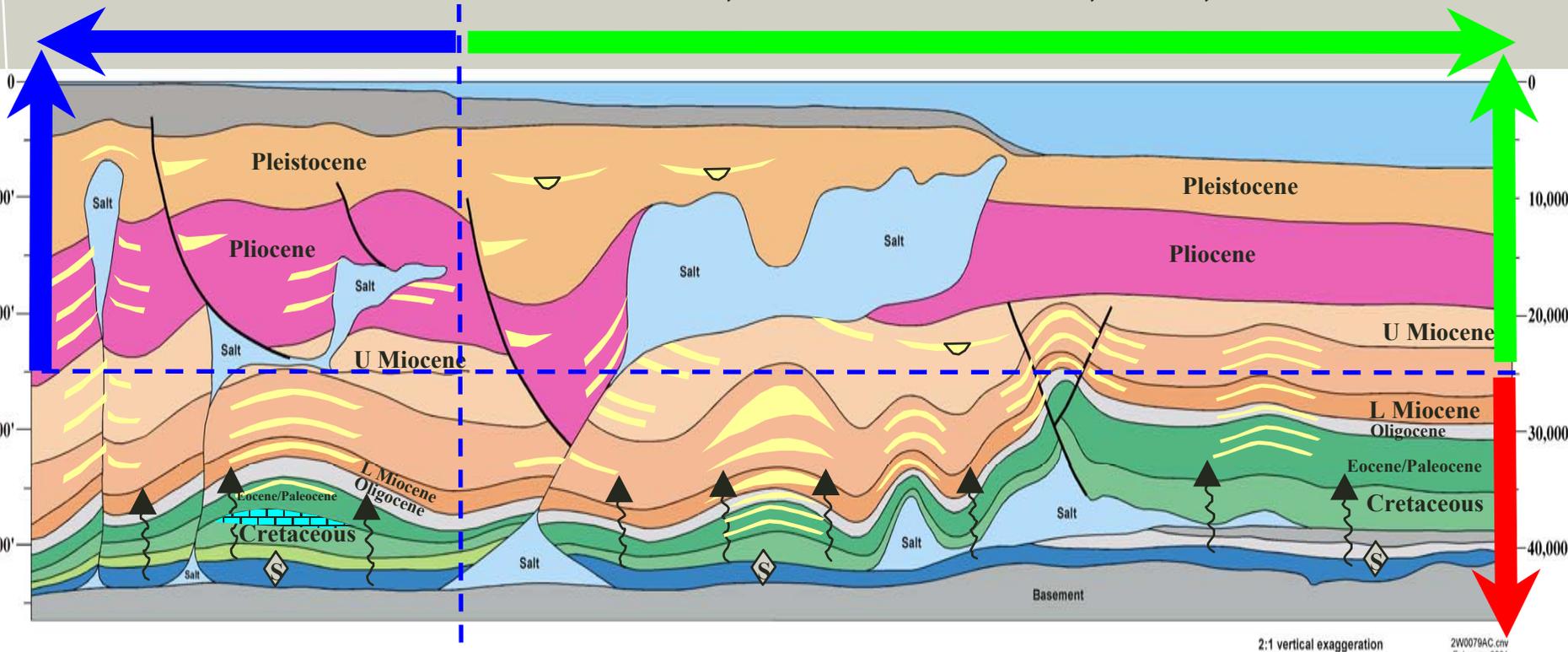

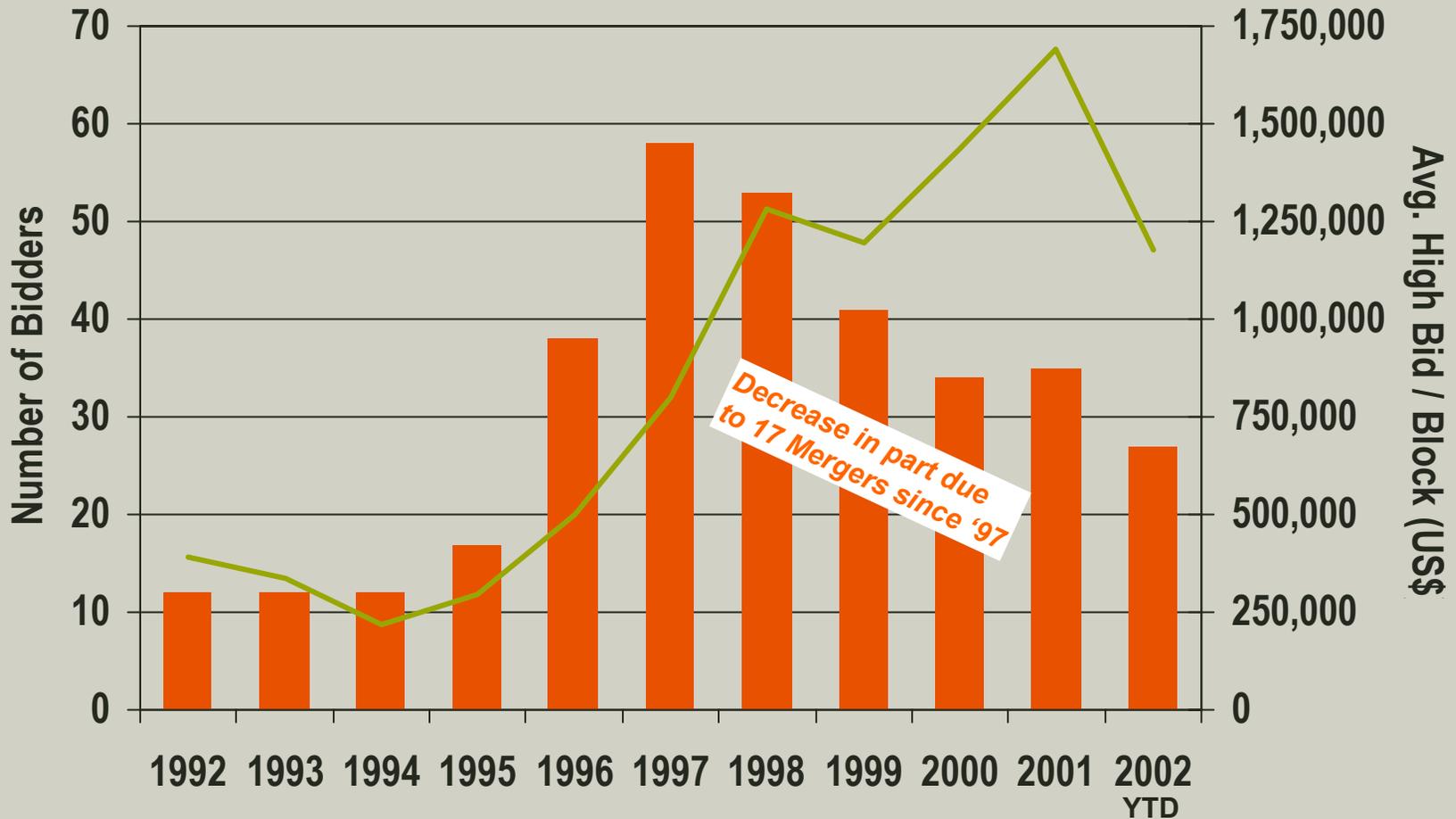

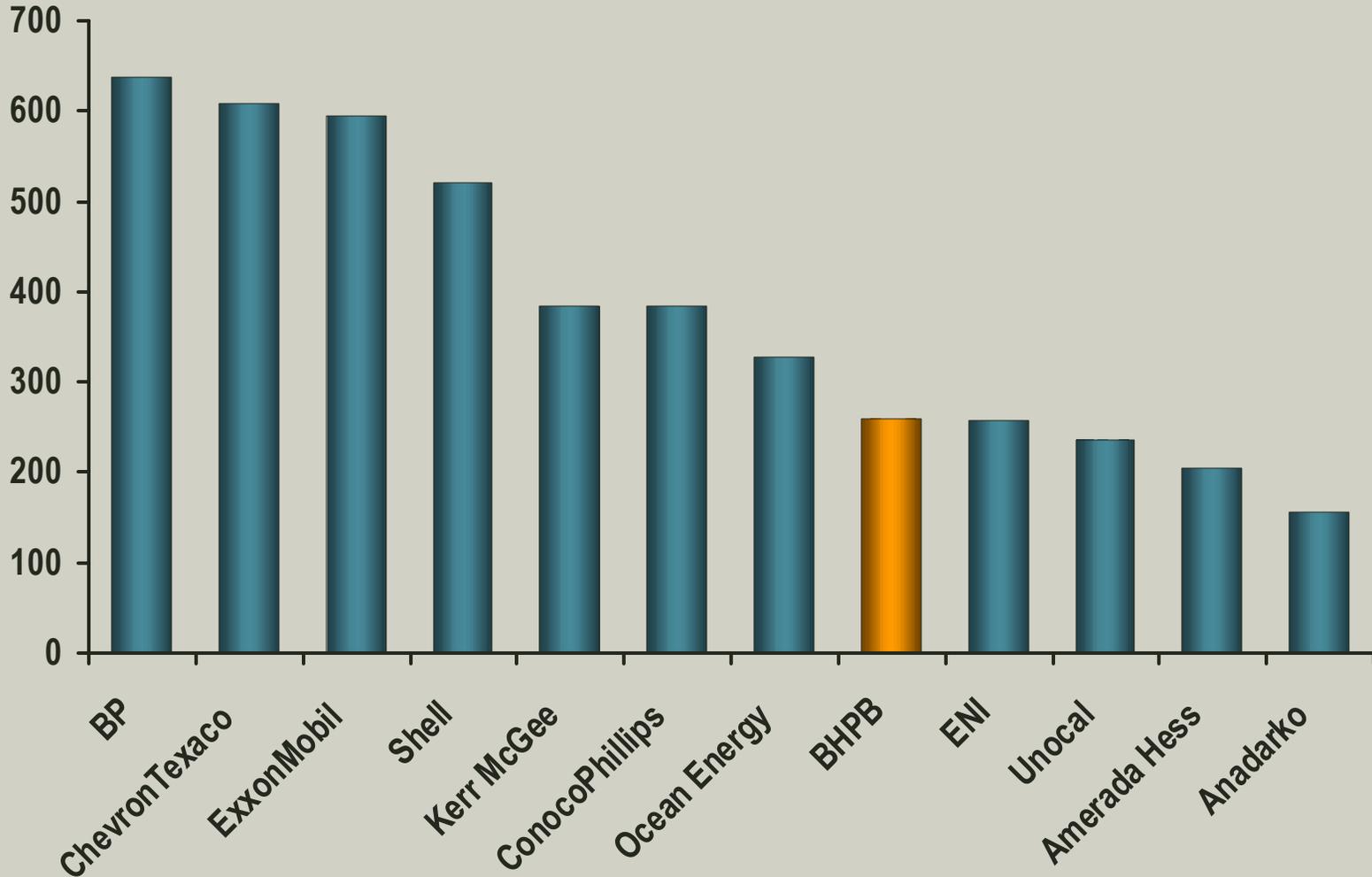

GoM Lease Sale Statistics Water Depths > 1500 ft.

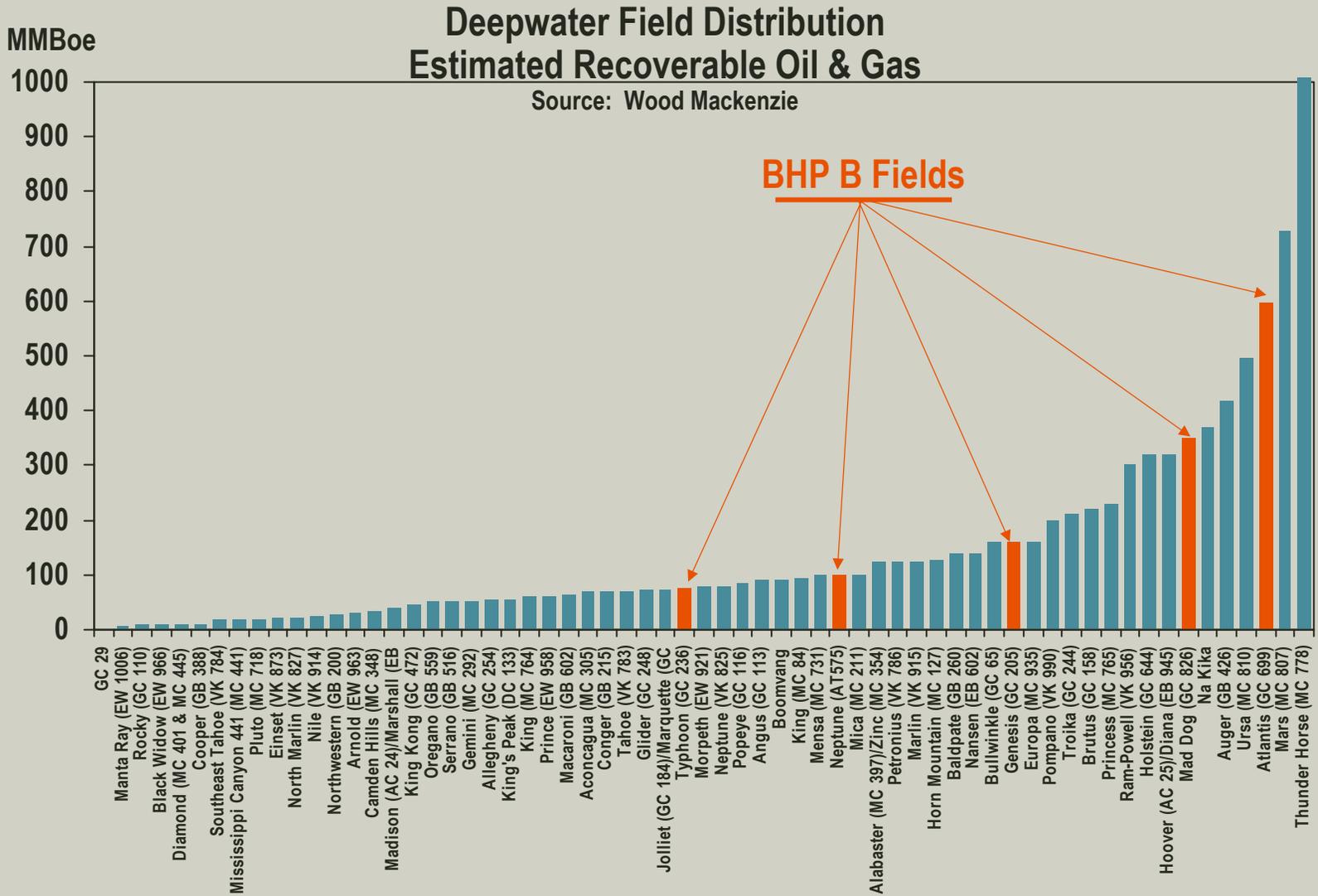


Gulf of Mexico deepwater leasehold ranking

Number of Leases

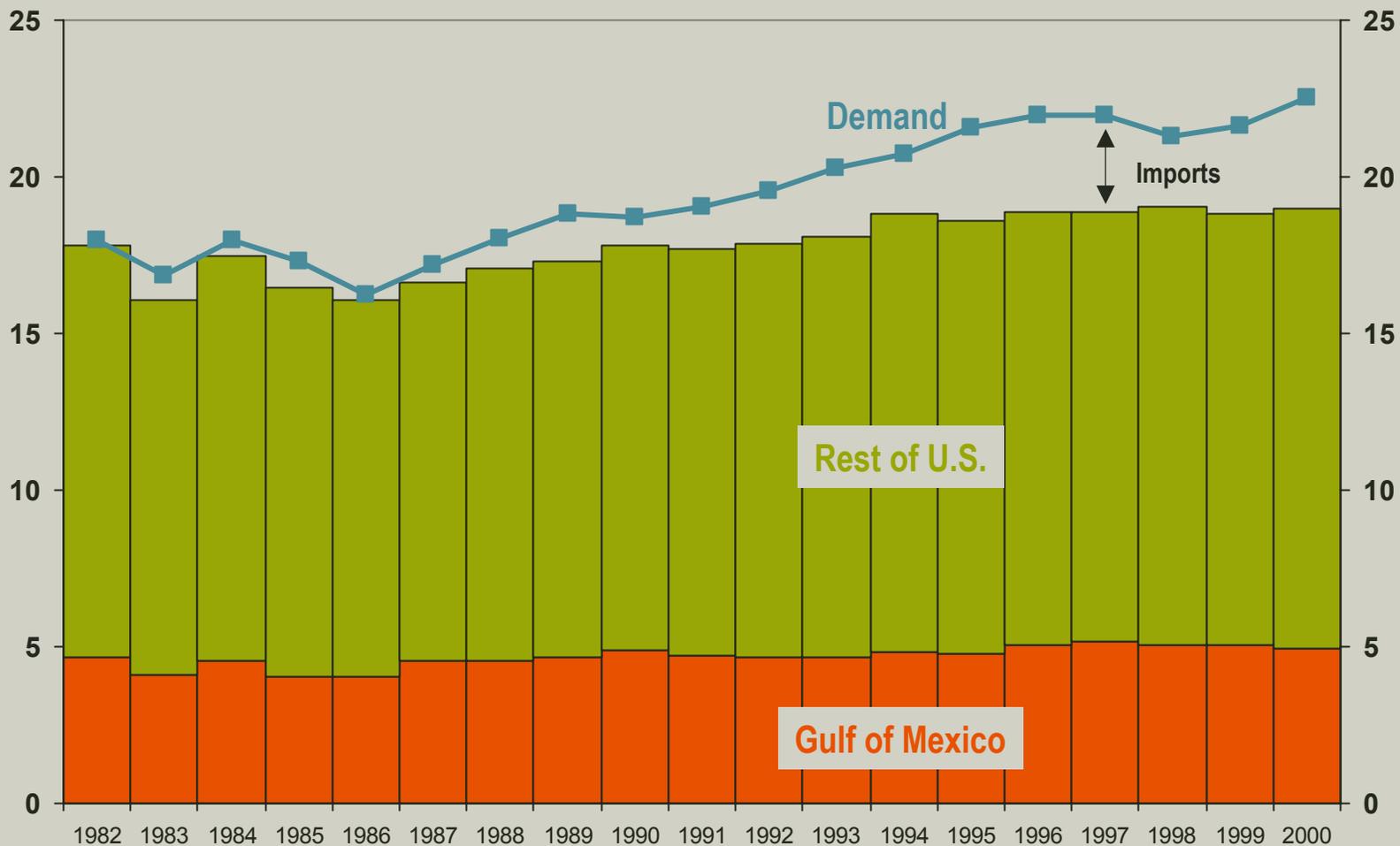


Gulf of Mexico Deepwater Discoveries



U. S. Natural Gas Supply / Demand

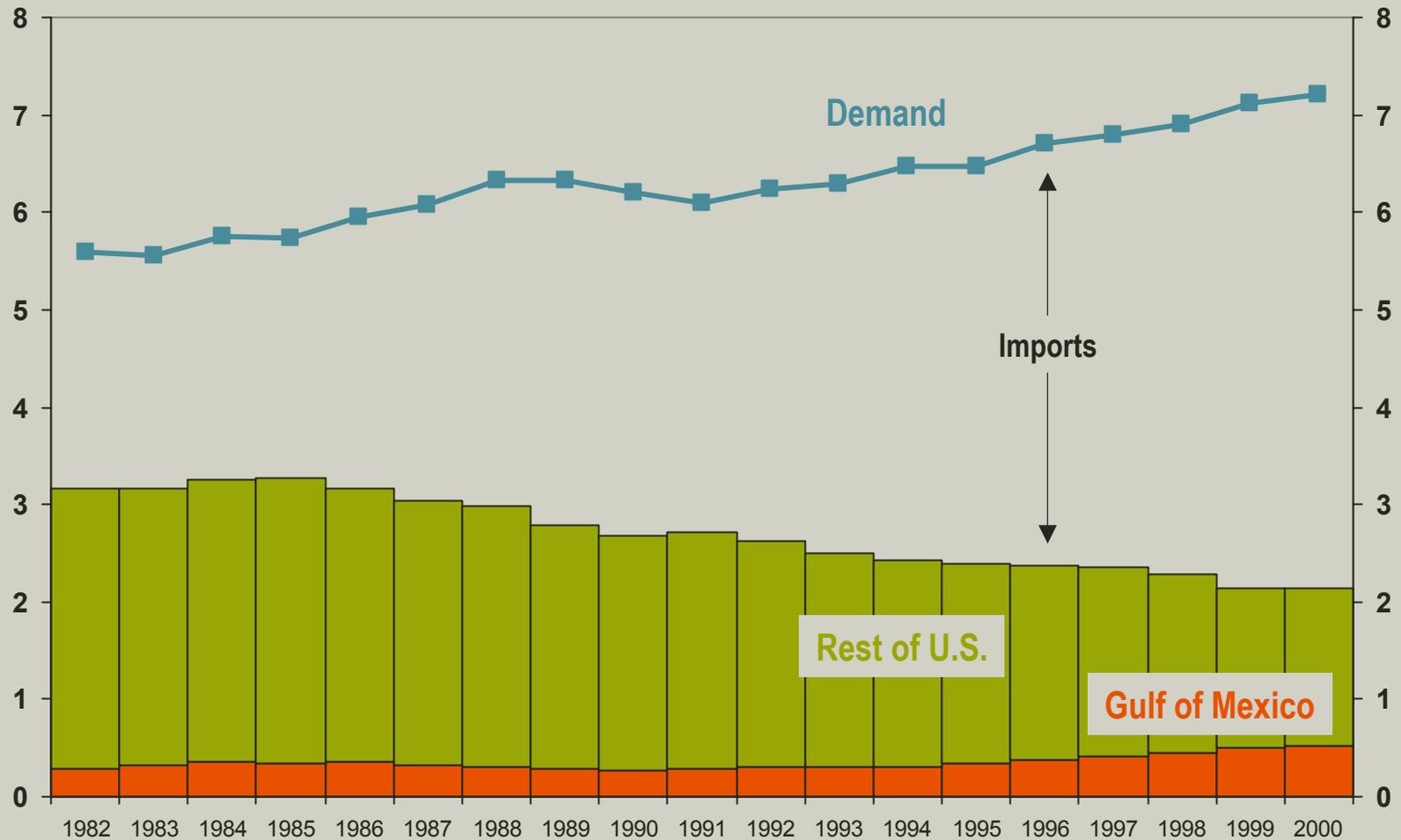

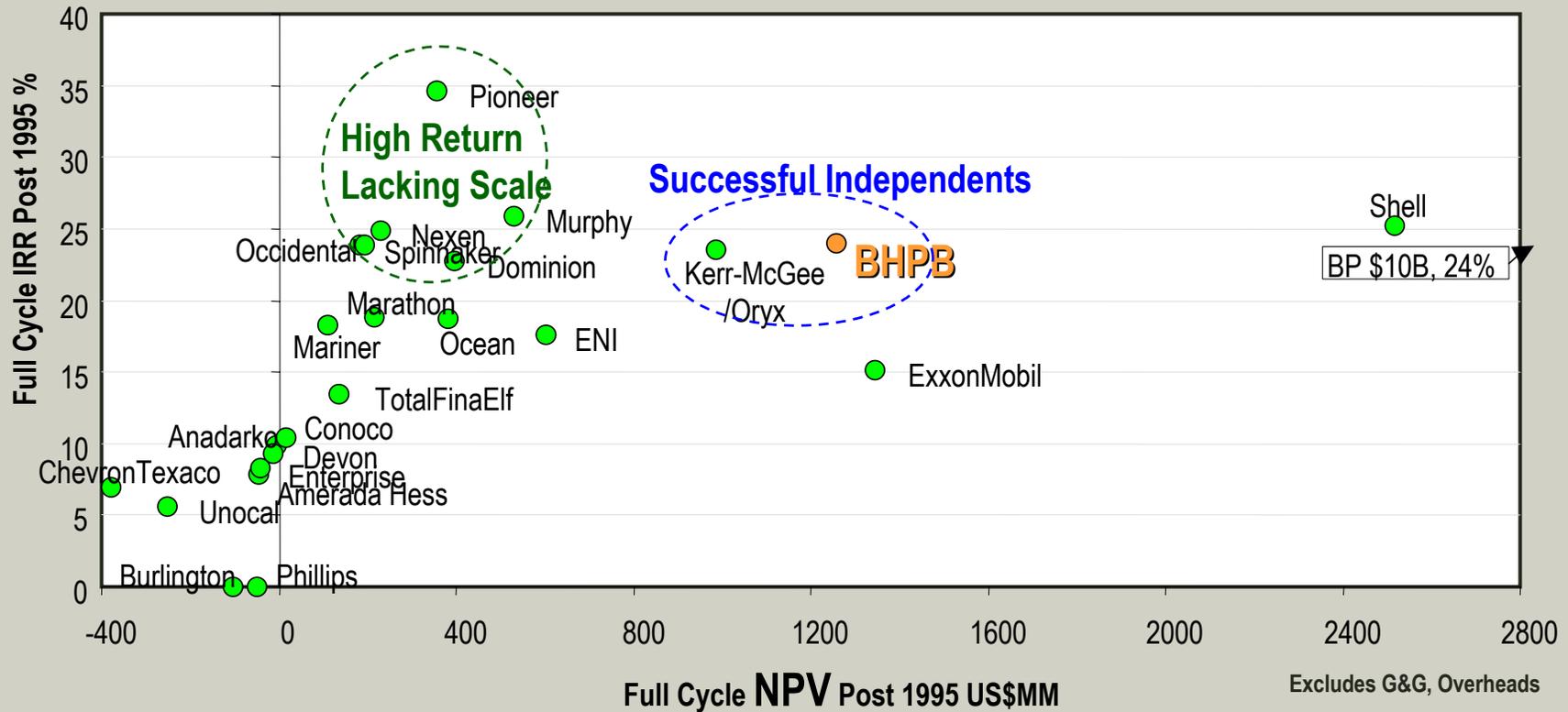

Competitive positions in the Gulf of Mexico

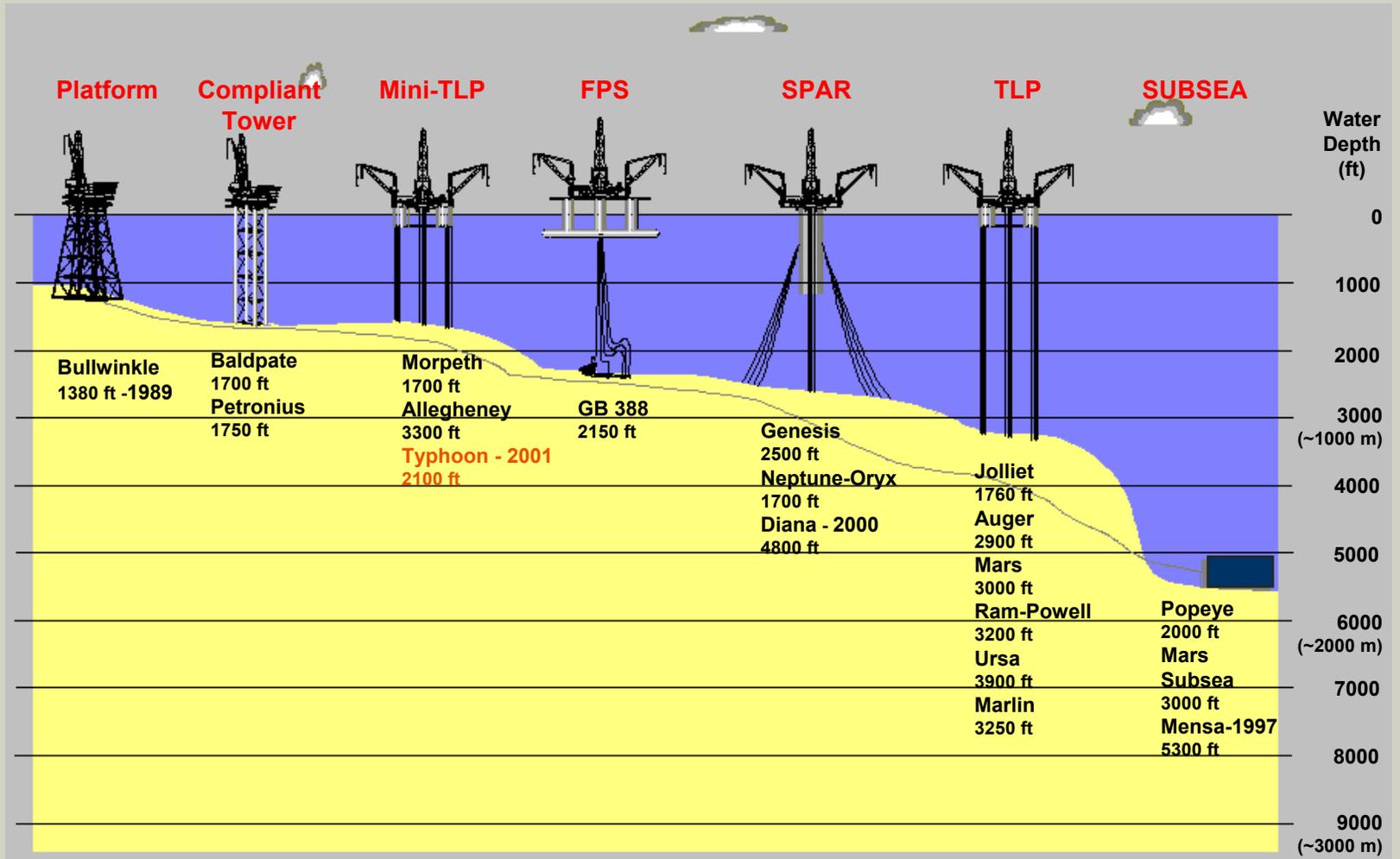
Deepwater Performance Post 1995



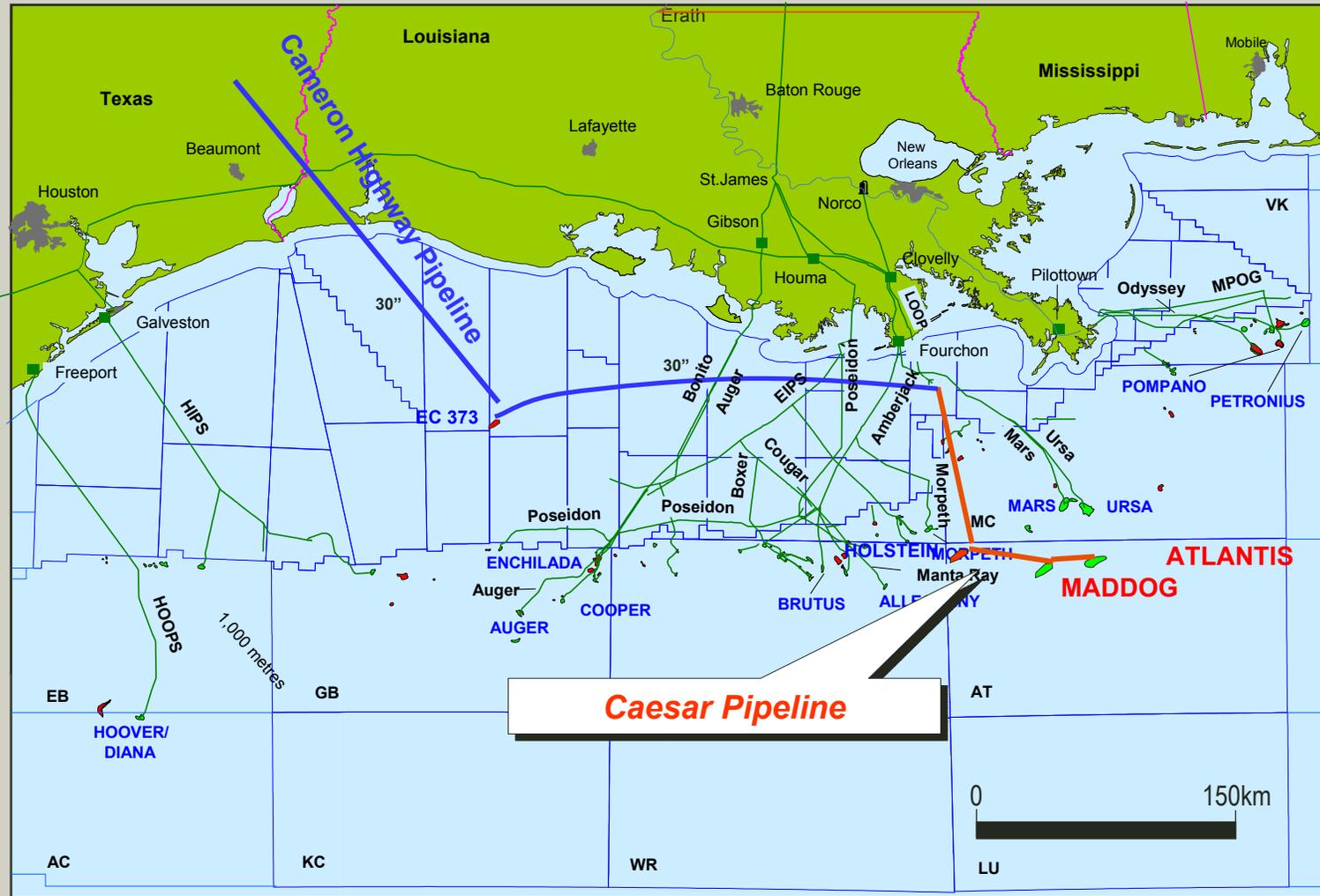

Deepwater production systems

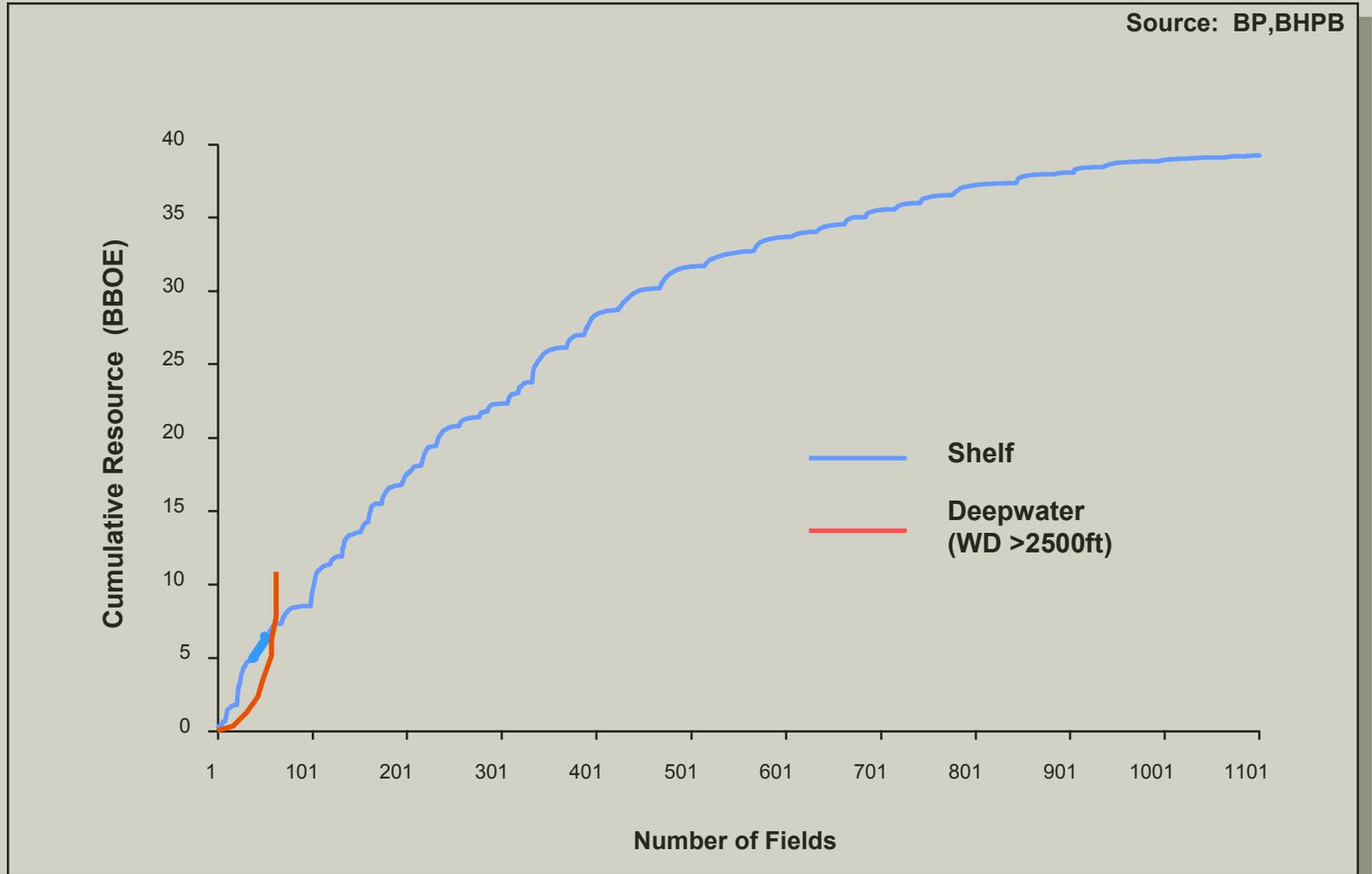
Progression 1989 - 2002
