EPBC 2023/09757 SARAJI MINE GREVILLEA PIT CONTINUATION PROJECT

s95B(2) of the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act)

The Saraji Mine Grevillea Pit Continuation Project initiated by BM Alliance Coal Operations Pty Ltd, proposes to extend existing open cut mining operations at Saraji Mine into Mining Lease 700021, near Dysart, Queensland.

The Saraji Mine Grevillea Pit Continuation Project (EPBC 2023/09757) was deemed a controlled action requiring assessment by preliminary documentation under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act). The controlling provisions under Part 3 of the EPBC Act are:

- Sections 18 and 18A: Listed threatened species and ecological communities.
- Sections 24D and 24E: Water resource in relation to a large coal mining development or coal seam gas development.

Pursuant to section 95A(3) of the EPBC Act, the referral and draft preliminary documentation was available for public viewing and comment from 5 May, 2026 to close of business on 18 May, 2026. Anyone was invited to submit comments in writing on the published material.

Pursuant to section 95B(2) of the EPBC Act, the final preliminary documentation, where public comments received have been addressed in Appendix N, is available for public viewing without charge in hard copy form at the following locations:
