Aim	Support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and organisations in their drive towards more effective governance and self-determination. Projects supported by the Australia Country Program seek to:

- convene a breadth of organisations with relevant expertise to collectively address common challenges through cross-sector dialogue and problem-solving
- take a sustainable approach to implementation which allows three to five years to effect change with a view to being self-sufficient after that time
- strengthen the capacity of civil society and institutions in recognition of the challenge of effective implementation of Indigenous projects that enable positive change in the lives of citizens
- draw on expertise from leaders in relevant fields, including within BHP Billiton, to support project design, implementation and monitoring
- focus on learning, building evidence and sharing good practice, together with partner organisations, to enhance outcomes and impact
- support transformative change through leadership, innovation and technology implemented locally by capable organisations which are informed by national and global learnings.

Australian STEM projects

The BHP Foundation has developed innovative partnerships to improve STEM outcomes for key target groups. Over A\$55 million has been committed to Australian programs to increase interest and academic achievement in STEM subjects and related professions.

Choose Maths - AMSI

The <u>Choose Maths</u> project, in partnership with the Australian Mathematical Sciences Institute (AMSI), is designed to change perceptions of studying mathematics with the aim of increasing uptake from girls and young women. Core components include professional development for teachers, additional curriculum resources for schools across the country, scholarships, networking support and an awards program to recognise excellence in both teaching and learning.

BHP Science and Engineering Awards – CSIRO

The Foundation supports the BHP Science and Engineering Awards, which aim to increase the number of students taking their science and engineering study to a tertiary level. The Awards are a partnership between the Foundation, CSIRO and the Australian Science Teachers' Association and have been recognising excellence among young scientists for 35 years.

Indigenous STEM - CSIRO

Through its partnership with CSIRO, the Foundation is investing in the <u>Indigenous STEM project</u> to increase interest and academic achievement among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in STEM subjects and related professions. The integrated elements within the five-year Indigenous STEM project build on successful education programs and include reward and recognition for student achievement.
